How to Become a Christ-Follower

- 1 Acknowledge your position before God.
God said, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). That means no matter how good we are, we don't measure up to God's standard of perfection (Isaiah 53:6). The outcome is spiritual separation from God (Romans 6:23).
- 2 Believe in Jesus Christ.
Believe that Jesus Christ, who was God in human flesh, died for your imperfections on the cross and was resurrected. His actions solved your sin problem by becoming your substitute (1 Peter 2:24, 3:18).
- 3 Express your belief through repentance + faith.
Repentance involves turning from all sinfulness (Acts 3:19). Faith means placing your trust in the promises of God through Jesus Christ (Acts 16:31).
