Flesh (σάρξ *sárx*):

- #1 Specifically flesh, a part of the body.
- #2 Physical life, humanness.
- #3 Sinful nature

Examples:

"For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit." Romans 8:5 ESV ~ "Flesh" = sinful nature

"Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy..." Galatians 5:19-20 ESV ~ "Flesh" = sinful nature

"For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh." 2 Corinthians 10:3 ESV ~ "Flesh" = Physical life

"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20 ESV ~ "Flesh" = Physical life

Fruitful Labor (καρπός καρπός ἔργον ἔργον) "Fruitful work, labor, life."

"O God, from my youth you have taught me, and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds. So even to old age and gray hairs, O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to another generation, your power to all those to come."

Depart (ἀναλύω analúō) "To journey, to depart, to set free."
